#### • Why do we test?

- To evaluate learning outcomes
- To identify strengths & weaknesses
- To improve teaching and learning

### Concept of Educational Test

• An educational test is a systematic procedure for measuring a sample of an individual's behavior or knowledge.

Helps assess learning progress and achievement.

• Can be formative or summative in nature.

#### Purpose of Educational Testing

- Diagnose learning difficulties
- Guide instruction
- Certify achievement
- Evaluate program effectiveness
- Predict future performance

## Types of Educational Tests

#### Based on Purpose:

- Formative Test
- Summative Test
- Diagnostic Test
- Placement Test

# Types (Continued)

#### Based on Format:

- Objective Tests (MCQs, True/False)
- Subjective Tests (Essays, Long answers)

#### Based on Mode:

- Oral Test
- Written Test
- Online/Computer-Based Test

#### Characteristics of a Good Test

- Validity Measures what it is intended to measure
- Reliability Consistency of test results
- Objectivity Free from personal bias
- Usability Easy to administer and score
- Discriminatory Power Differentiates between high and low achievers

#### Validity

- Types:
  - Content Validity
  - Construct Validity
  - Criterion-related Validity
- A test must be aligned with learning objectives.

#### Reliability

- A reliable test gives consistent results over time.
- Types:
  - Test-Retest Reliability
  - Split-Half Reliability
  - Inter-Rater Reliability

#### Objectivity

- Scoring should be free of examiner bias
- Standardized scoring keys improve objectivity

#### Usability

- Easy to administer, time-efficient, and practical
  - Should not require excessive resources
    - Discriminatory Power
- Ability to distinguish between students with different levels of understanding
  - Avoids too easy or too difficult items
