1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the college:

The college made wide publicity of its admission notice by displaying festoons and posters. Students coming from North 24 Parganas and adjoining districts were helped through counselling to choose the right course for them. The teaching and non-teaching staff of the college played an active part in it. Female students were particularly encouraged to continue their study,

because women's education is a crying need in our country. Teachers took initiative to make lessons attractive to the learners.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

No new academic programme was initiated this year.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

The teachers of this college took care that the curriculum as designed by the affiliating university was implemented properly. They ascertained that all the students were familiar with the university syllabus. They adopted the lecture method as well as evaluated the students' progress through class tests and oral tests etc.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

The teachers of English Department took some classes in the Bengali Department to cover relevant parts of the syllabus. The teachers of Economics Department took classes in courses conducted by the Commerce Department, both General and Honours. As per WBSU syllabus, Environment Science is a compulsory subject for all the courses in Part-I of Arts, Commerce and Science streams. Thus the teachers of the Geography Department met the students of all the streams while dealing with Environment Science.

5. Examination reforms implemented :

The college being an affiliated institute under WBSU cannot itself initiate reforms of Examination that is conducted by the university. As for internal evaluation, the college arranged for oral tests, class tests and special tests as per the requirement of the students.

The administrative works of the college are done mainly with the aid of computers. Admission notices were published through computer printing. The examination results, as published by the university were electronically designed and printed. The degree certificates are also electronically finished and designed.

27. Increase in the infrastructural facilities:

In order to facilitate effective teaching and learning, the college authority was mindful to increase the learning space for students. Hence an amount of Rs. 63,49,856/- was spent during the year for building construction. For the computer centre, new accessories were purchased. New books and journals were purchased for the library so that students and teachers might use there.

28. Technology up gradation :

For technological up gradation, equipments of value Rs. 2,83,254 were bought.

Teachers used Laptops in classes to demonstrate different study matters to students.

Internet connection was available for students and teachers in the library and Evnet (college computer centre).

29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers, non-teaching staff and students:

For ICT-related subjects students have access to computer in Evnet. Teachers may use departmental laptops, computers at Evnet and library and the network connection available in the college.

No institutional training programme in computer for staff was conducted last year.

30. Financial aid to students:

Scholarship and stipend (sponsored by Labour Welfare Organization) to the tune of Rs. 39,000/- were disbursed among the students this year following Govt. rules. The Minority Development authority, too, sanctioned stipend to the deserving students. In addition to this, needy and meritorious students were granted financial aid from Student Welfare Fund and Student Aid Fund.

31. Activities and support from the Alumni Association :

The Alumni Association held its meeting on 01/04/2010 and its suggestions regarding the following matters:

- a) Constructions of more space for Teaching learning, library and laboratory.
- b) Keeping the campus healthy and clean.

32. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association :

There was no formal parent-teacher association. However, the teachers and the Principal gathered feed back from them when they met them on various issues.

33. Health services:

The college has a health unit which provided frist-aid treatment to students and staff during the year.

34. Performance in sports activities :

The college encouraged sports activities among the students. The Students' Union organized Annual sports for the students in the playground of the college. Students participated in in-door games in the college common-rooms throughout the year.

35. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons:

Promising sportspersons were encouraged to do better in future. Prizes were given to candidates securing 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions in different events.
