PROSPECTUS

RISHI BANKIM CHANDRA EVENING COLLEGE (RBCEC) is a Government aided institution of graduate studies enjoying accreditation conferred by NAAC. The College offers courses in B. A., B. Com. and B. Sc. named after the celebrated litterateur Rishi Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyaya and situated close to his birth place, the college caters to the needs of higher education of the districts of North 24 Parganas and adjoining Nadia and Hooghly. As a centre of higher studies, this institution acts both as an upholder of academic values and as a contributor towards social and economic empowerment of the young people in the neighborhood. By imparting graduate education in Arts, Commerce and Science, the College has proved its enduring concern for society at large over sixty years. The College now has plans to embark on extension programs, and so has constructed a new four- storied building to add excellence to the existing machinery.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The college was originally founded in 1947 by some noted educationists of the neighborhood. It was housed then in Naihati Mahendra School building and as classes were held in evening hours, had the name Rishi Bankim Chandra College (Evening). In the following years, Day Section and Morning Section of the College were added. Thus, the then Rishi Bankim Chandra College was born and within a very short span of time it drew the acclaim and attention of the public and academics of note. Following the trifurcation of the parent institution in 1984 for administrative purposes, the present Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College emerged as a full-fledged independent unit. In addition to imparting University affiliated courses of graduate level, the College has a plan for introduction of career advancement courses in collaboration with efficient institutes in different disciplines.

THE LOGO

The Logo of the College bears the mention of the year 1947 in it to indicate the year of foundation when the undivided college was started in the evening time, and later, in 1984, Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College emerged out of the parent institution.

The seven-leaf Deodar bough in the Logo symbolizes the ‘Saptaparni’ traditionally offered to successful students with the conferring of degree by traditional Indian Viswa Vidyalaya.

COLLEGE HOURS

Classes are held from 4-30 PM to 9-15 PM. Office remains open from 3-30 PM to 9-30 PM on all working days. Cash transactions are carried out at the cash counter between 4-00 PM and 8-30 PM.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

Medium of instruction is Bengali or English. In college examinations questions are to be answered in either of the above two languages except in language papers.

ADMISSION

The College is open for admission to both male and female students in graduate courses. Selection for admission is based on school leaving academic records and counselling. The admission process starts immediately after the publication of the results of the H.S. Examination of different recognized Indian Boards or Councils. The admission of migrating students is provisional and is confirmed only after the production of migration certificate. Concessions for admission to SC/ST/OBC students are allowable as per University guide lines. For the purpose of admission, candidates have to apply online and there is a detailed guideline regarding this in the college website: www.rbcec.in. They are required to follow the steps mentioned in the item titled **Admission Procedure** in the website. Provision for financial assistance to needy students is made under students' Welfare Fund and Students' Aid Fund only after they have been admitted as bona fide students of this institution.

The University guidelines for attendance in classes, college tests and University Examinations are mandatory for all students. Students are expected to maintain the discipline of the college on and off the college campus and participate in the extra-curricular activities like sports, annual fests and other programs as organized by the college or its constituent bodies.

COLLEGE TESTS

Regular tests, class tests etc. are held according to University guidelines and usual norms. The results of these tests are considered for determining eligible candidates for University Examinations.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

University examinations are the passport for obtaining the degree certificate. They are held under the supervision of the University semester-wise and the publications of results are communicated through the College Office. The Examinations are mandatory for the continuance of studies in the graduate courses.

UNIT, CENTERS AND ACTIVITIES

Central Library

The computerized central library of the college has a rich collection of books 47,586 titles as on 31.03.2014 and adds nearly 1000 new titles every year. Further enrichment is going to be made from time to time. All students, teaching and non-teaching staffs of the college can avail this facility. The ex-students and sometimes the outsiders can avail reading-room facility.

EVNET (Computer Centre)

EVNET, the Computer Centre of the College, is located on the second floor of the college building. The Centre was established to impart computer education to the students of this college. It is a run by a committee formed by the Governing Body of the college. The Centre offers ICT Classes to the students of Commerce, Physics and Mathematics Departments.

The Centre also comes in handy in training students of regular degree courses, B. Com (Honours and General), B. Sc Geography (Honours) having practical papers in Information Technology, C+ System and Geography Information System. Students from Film Studies are also allowed.

The Computer Centre (EVNET) is equipped with internet facilities offering free access to students, teachers and the staff. Extensive use of the facility is being made for library materials and communication (email and fax).

Reprographic Facilities

This facility is available. It is used for development of teaching materials and for official purposes.

Film Studies and Projection Unit

The unit makes use of the following equipments: (i) TC Set (ii) DVD Player (iii) CD-Player (iv) Overhead Projector (v) LED Projector (vi) Handy camera.

Film studies course which includes Video Film is the principal user besides other departments for class lecture, seminar, extension activities and social work.

College Magazine

The College Magazine 'Sarathi' is published by the Students' Union annually. It contains the literary creations of the students and a report of their activities throughout the year.

Web Journal

The English Department is running a web journal titled Foot-steps. Creative writings of students and faculty are published in it.

Research Projects

Faculties have carried out research projects sponsored by different government agencies, namely Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) and UGC.

Health Unit

The health unit caters to the immediate and emergent needs of the students and the staff. All admitted students of this college become members of the Students Health Home (HQ at Moulali, Kolkata) and can avail advanced medical facilities.

Language and Communication Lab

The college plans to develop students' skill in language by setting up a communication lab.

Common Room & Conference Room

There are separate common rooms for students with facilities of different indoor games. The students and staff of the college can avail the facility of a Conference Room with seating arrangement for 250 persons. The hall, with a dais, has a fairly satisfactory acoustic system.

Canteen

Students and staff of the college can avail the canteen facility. It is providing good quality food at moderate rate in spacious and hygienic atmosphere.

Playground

The playground is situated on the eastern side of the college premises. It is within ten minutes' walking distance from the college, being fairly large in size. Football, Cricket and many other matches are played on this ground throughout the year along with Annual sports and games of the college.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC unit of the college is fairly large. The members take part in weekly parades and other activities, under the guidance of the NCC officer, Prof. R. K. Datta, a teacher of the college. They take part in the special functions on Republic Day and Independence Day when national flag is hoisted and guard of honour is received by the Principal. They rush to flood

affected areas to provide relief by providing medicines and garments. Besides these the cadets take active part in social service like adult education, sanitation, tree plantation, area cleaning etc. They also take leading part in conducting anti-dowry, anti-drug and anti-Aids awareness programs.

National Social Service Unit (NSS)

The college has also an NSS unit. It is run by a teacher, namely Dr. ATM Sahadatulla. Along with members of NSS the unit conducts several social activities and awareness programs on Health, Hygiene, Cleanliness, Plantation, Environment, Social Service, Welfare and Relief works.

Special Programs for the benefit of the students

Remedial Coaching Classes for SC/ ST/ OBC/ Minority/ Economically backward students. Orientation and Career Counselling for SC/ ST/ OBC/ Minority/ Economically Backward students.

Cultural Unit

Cultural meets of departments and other bodies of teacher are held at different occasions.

Financial Assistance

Poor and meritorious student, having regular attendance and good performance in the test and university examinations, are provided with financial assistance from Students' Welfare Fund and Students' Aid Fund. There are committees formed by the Governing Body, with student, non-teaching staff and teaching staff as members to look into the process of selection and distribution of available fund.

Free Studentship

This is limited for few students who have secured very high marks in H.S or equivalent examination.

Annual Sports and Games

Annual Sports and Game are Held in the month of December-January of year. Members of the students' Union help in a big way to conduct such events. The college ground is decorated with multi-colored festoons and flags. A temporary colourful camp is constructed on the round for the participants and the supervisors. Essential amenities including drinking water, food, medical unit etc. are made available in the camp. The Principal declares opening for the meet and then accepts guard of honour from the parading participants. Competitions on several events on athletics and game are held separately for boys and girls. Arrangements are made so that non-teaching and teaching staff of the college can take part in some events chosen for them. Prizes are then distributed to the successful participants. The principal then declares closing of the ceremony for the year.

Other Cultural Activities

The students, with active participation of the administration, hold several other Cultural programs including Debate, Exhibition, Antakshari, Quiz, Basantautsav, Rabindra Joyanti etc. Winning participants are awarded prizes on the day of annual Function of the college.

Annual Functions

College observed Republic Day, Independence Day and West Bengal state University Foundation Day Celebration. Two functions are held each year, one called 'Navin Baran' (Welcome to new entrants) is held generally in the month of September after the admission to first year classes are over. All students, teachers and non-teaching staff of the college participation in the program. The other function, the Social is held in the month of February-March featuring cultural programs including drama, songs etc. Career fair is added attraction. Prizes are distributed from the dais especially to the recipients of Prof Arun Kr. Mukherjee Prizes. Dr. Sudhir Ranjan Dasgupta Memorial Prize, Dr. Shanti Ranjan Dasgupta Memorial Prize. Saraswati Puja is organized every year in the college premises. Students participate in grand feasts held at that time.

Class Seminars

Inter-departmental and intra-departmental seminars are held often. Students are asked to deliver a lecture on selected topic in presence of other students and teachers. Different academic departments of the college hold various meets and cultural programs for students and staff, the notables among them being Departmental Freshers' Welcome and Farewells, Bhasha Bibash, Hindi Diwas etc.
